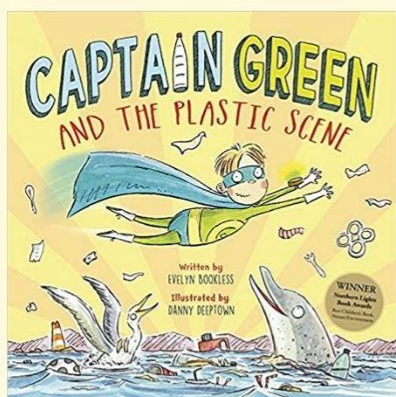


KEEP the SEA PLASTIC FREE

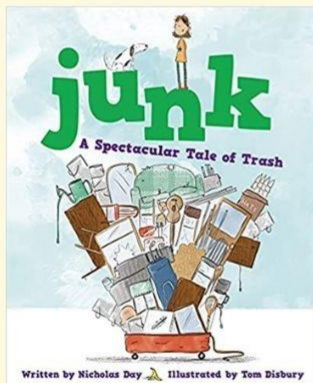
