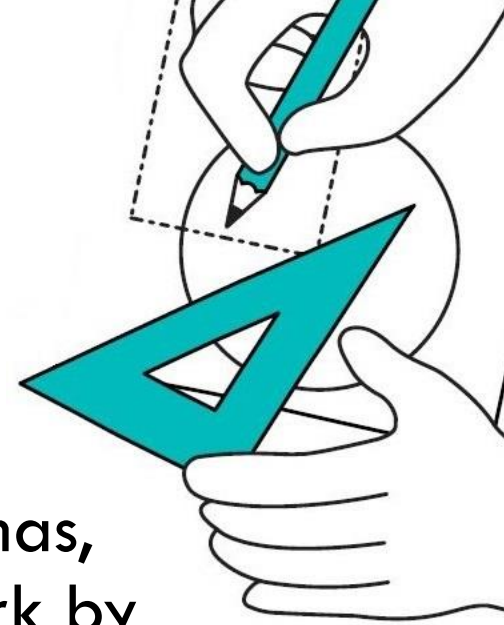
This package provides Tweens the opportunity to problem-solve through a do-it-yourself activity.

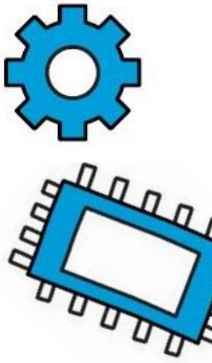

MAKE ZENTANGLE ART!

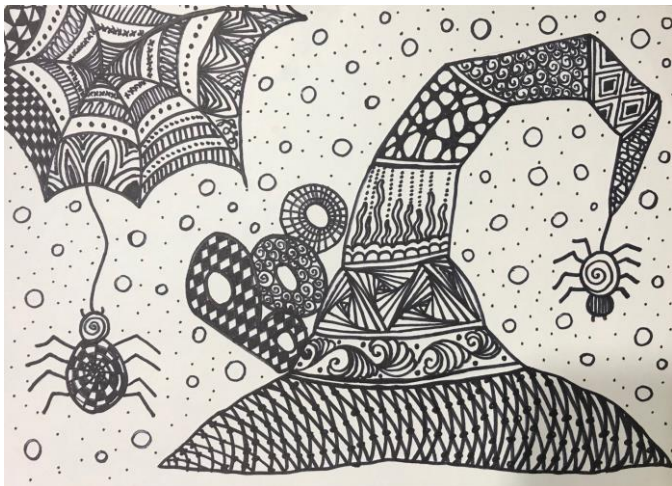
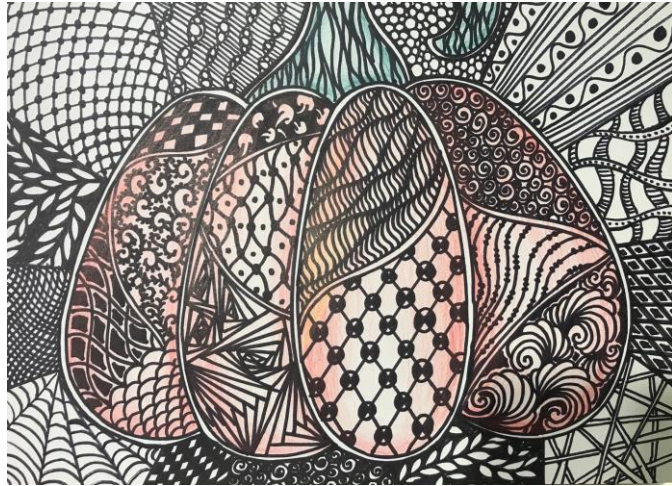

Fill up the blank picture templates provided here with different tangles!





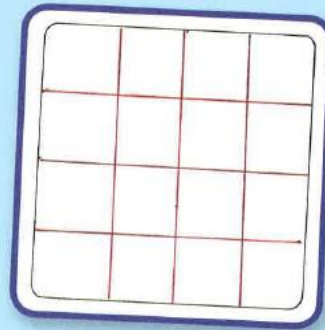

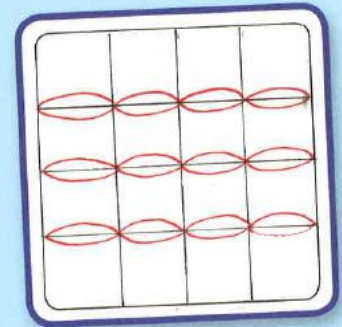
HOW TO “TANGLE”

Bales

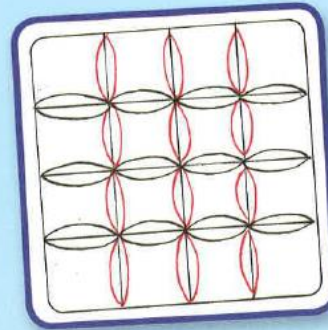
Bales is great fun to draw, and it's simple, too! Follow these easy steps to make your own Bales tangle.



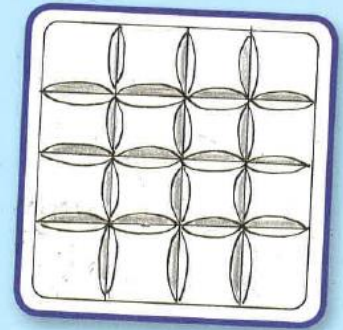
1. Begin by drawing a grid in your space.



2. Add small oval shapes around the horizontal lines of each square in your grid.




3. Then, do the same down the vertical lines.




4. Finally, add some shade to your tangle.


HOW TO “TANGLE”




Tipple is a great tangle to use for filling bigger spaces in your creations. It creates a bubbly feel, which is perfect for this seahorse!




1. Begin by drawing a string of circles touching one another.



2. Draw more circles of different sizes to fill the space.

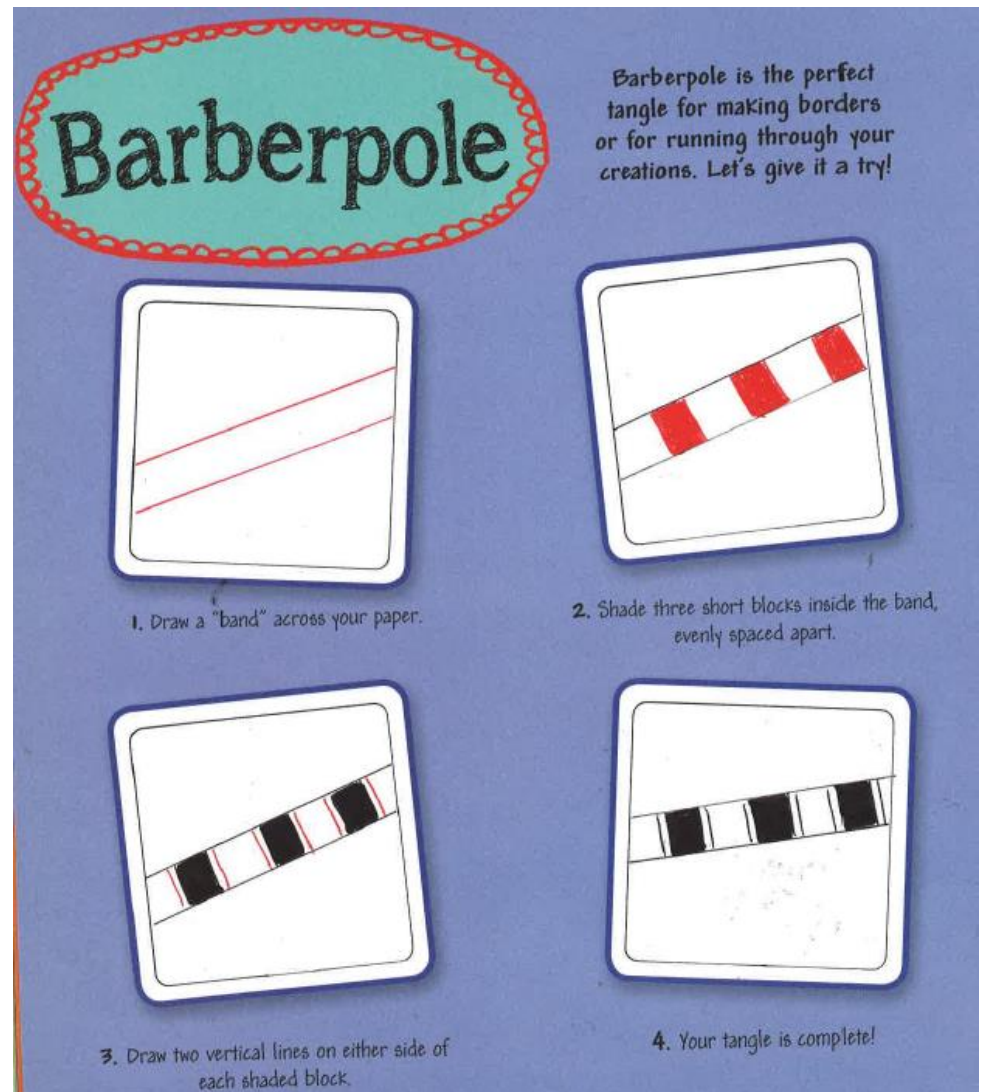


3. Finally, shade in the circles to give them more depth.

HOW TO “TANGLE”

Keeko

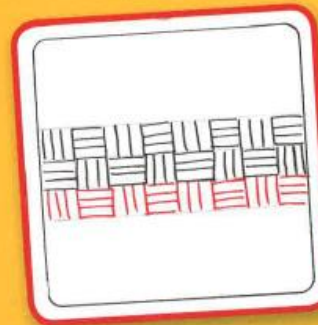
This tangle looks a little bit like feathers, so it's great for this owl! Follow these steps to draw your own Keeko tangle.



1. Create a cross to begin. Draw three vertical lines in the top left square, then three horizontal lines in the top right square. Do the opposite in the squares below.



2. Repeat this pattern to create a band across your paper.



3. Add another row underneath.



4. Finally, shade your tangle to give it more depth.

HOW TO “TANGLE”

Cruffle

I love to use *Cruffle* when making cards and bookmarks. Follow these simple steps to create your own *Cruffle* tangle.



1. Start with a circle in the middle of your paper. Draw a wiggly line through the middle.



2. Draw a raindrop shape on the right-hand side, with the tip at the bottom of the circle.



3. Fill the right-hand side with raindrop shapes that get smaller and smaller.

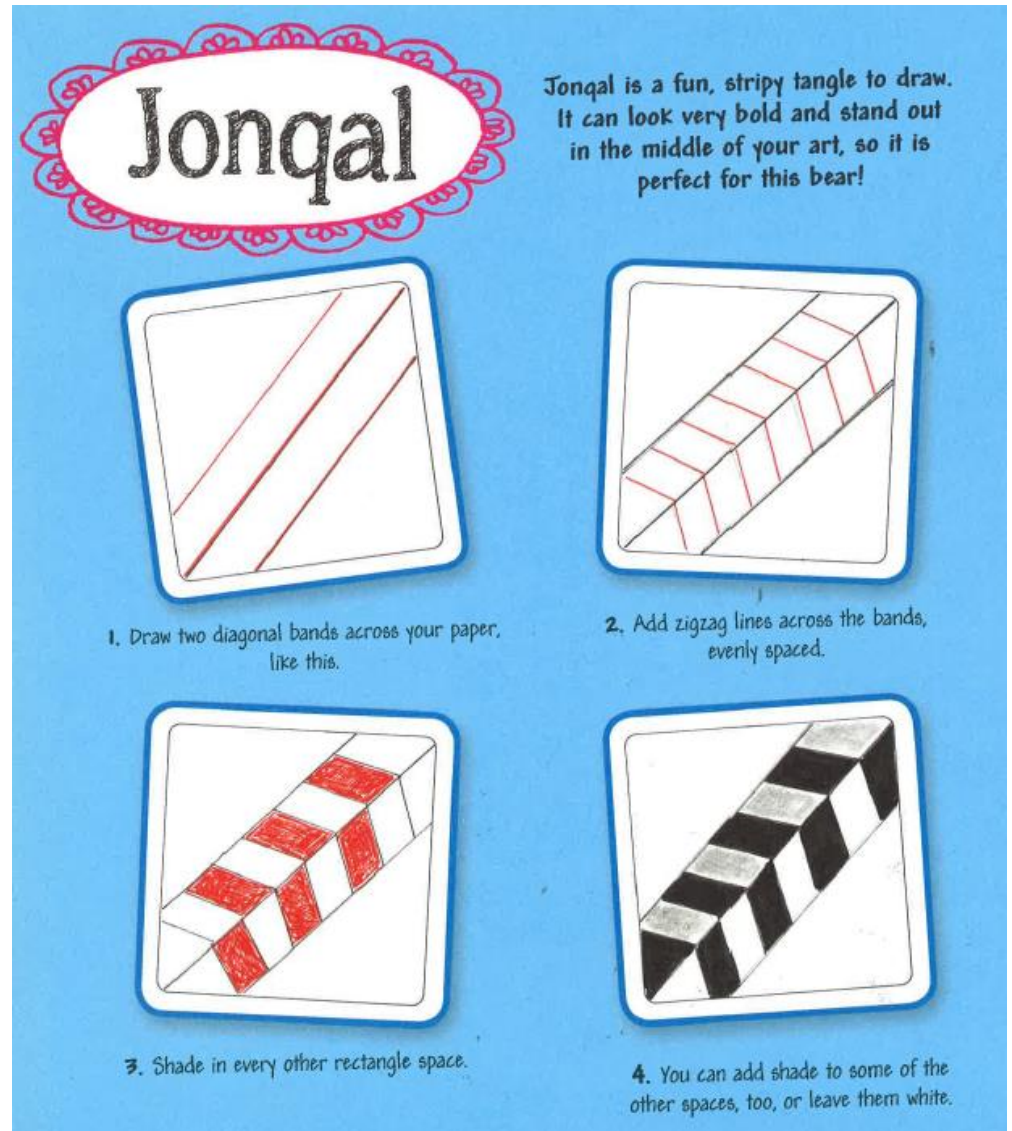


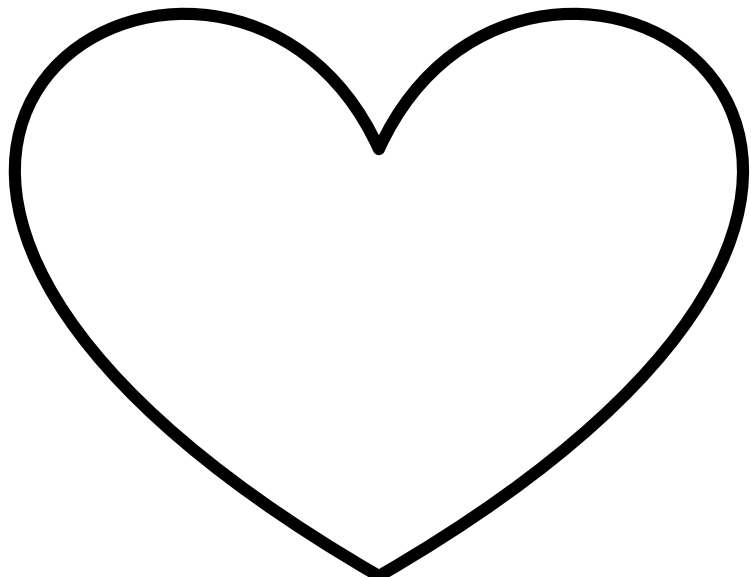
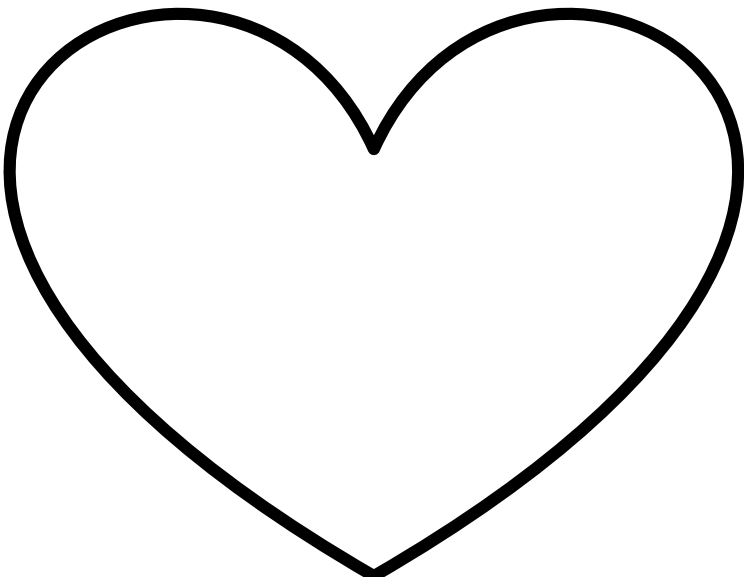
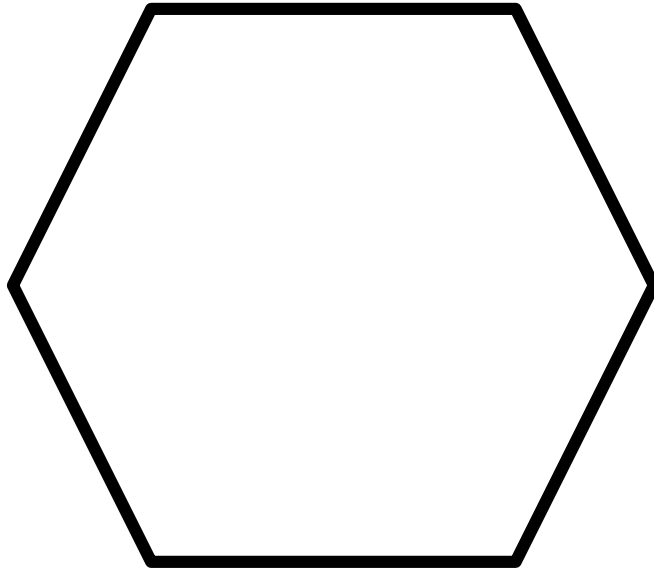
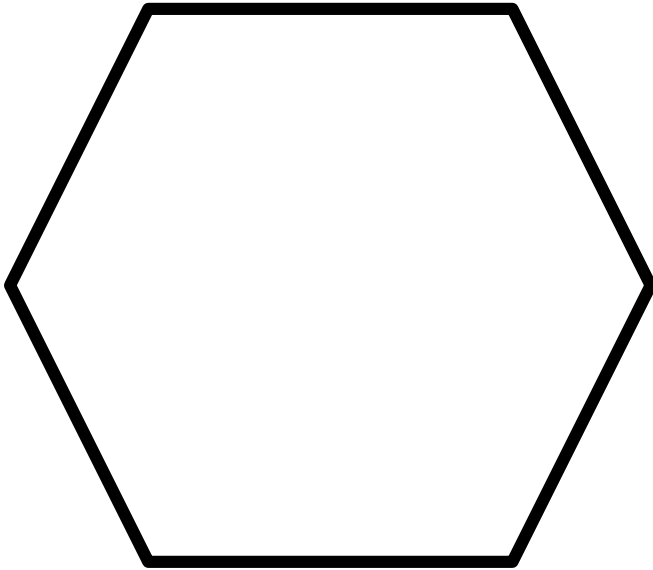
4. Add some shade to your tangle.



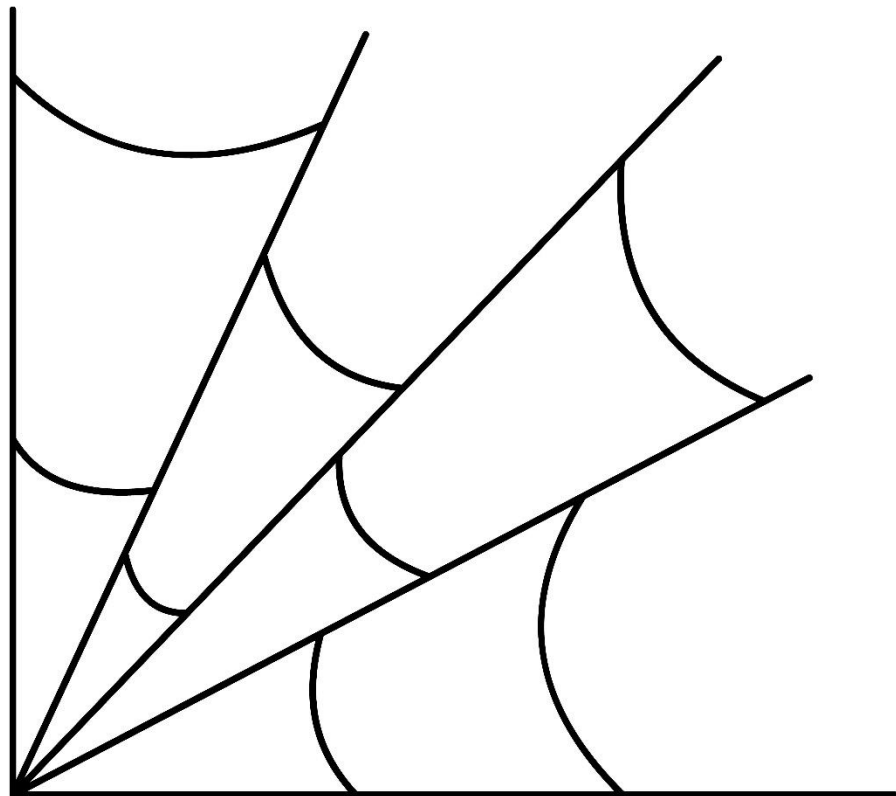
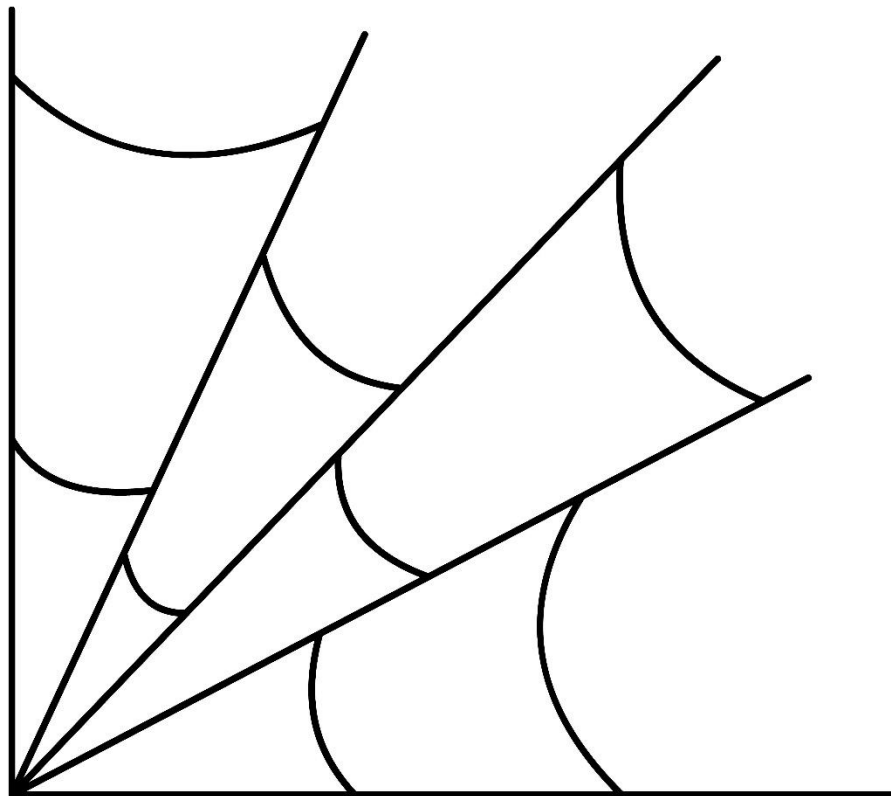
5. You can fill in the left-hand side, too, if you like.
