




The haiku is a short poem usually composed of three lines.

5-7-5! That should be easy enough to remember.

The haiku is a type of poem that originated from Japan.

Matsuo Bashō, the Japanese poet, popularised the haiku form during the Edo period (1603-1867) as he travelled through the country and wrote verses on the natural scenery he encountered.

Given the haiku's compact structure, the writer of a haiku must not use more words than needed. Ideally, a haiku should be read in one breath.

Below is an example of a haiku on the night sky:






Poem Types and Poetic Devices

A poetic device is a literary tool that writers and poets use to enrich their writing. What are some poetic devices you know? Can you also name a few types of poems other than the haiku?

- 2. When the last syllables of words sound similar, they can be said to ____. Examples: love/dove, whirl/swirl, sun/fun.
- **5.** A poetic device that assigns human attributes to animals, plants, and inanimate objects. Example: The flowers **danced** in the wind.
- 7. Words that mimic the sounds they are describing. Examples: *The cat meowed*. The car honked.
- **10**. A poetic device that compares two objects using the words 'like' and 'as'. Example: Her dress was <u>as</u> white <u>as</u> pearl. The children ate <u>like</u> pigs.

Down

- 1. Words that start with the same first consonant sound and appear closely together in a sentence. Example: The <u>musical merrymakers march in.</u>
- **3.** A long, narrative poem usually on heroic acts and adventures from a distant past. The *Iliad* by Homer is an example of such a poem.
- 4. Five, seven, five! What am I?
- **6.** A fourteen-line poem with a formal rhyme scheme that usually centres on the topic of love. William Shakespeare is famous for this!
- **8.** A form of poetry that praises and celebrates its subject. The subject could be nature, a person, or an event.
- **9.** A poem that expresses grief and mourning.


